LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: COMMUNITY MEALS



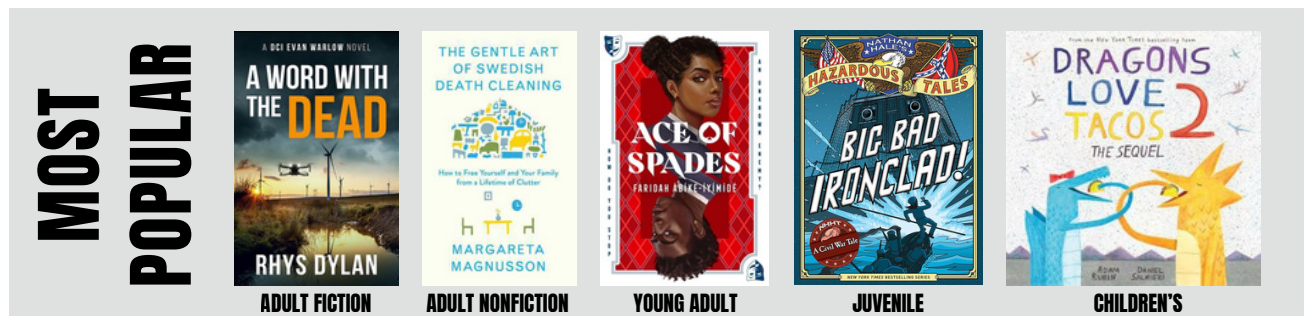
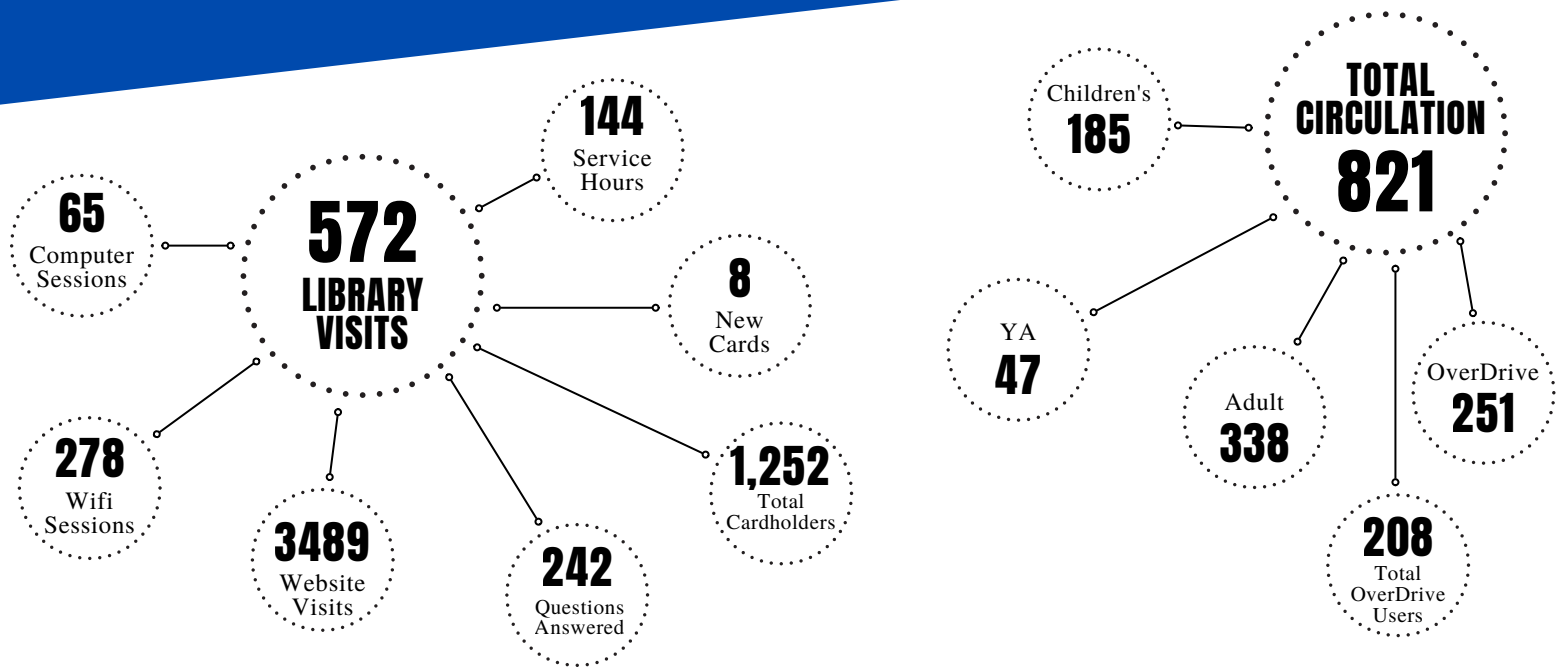
- During November, the North Douglas Library District partnered with North Douglas Betterment, the Friends of the Mildred Whipple Library, and local volunteers to help provide 3 free meals to community members. North Douglas Betterment sponsored the meals and the District rented the space and provided giveaway books and handouts of local resources.

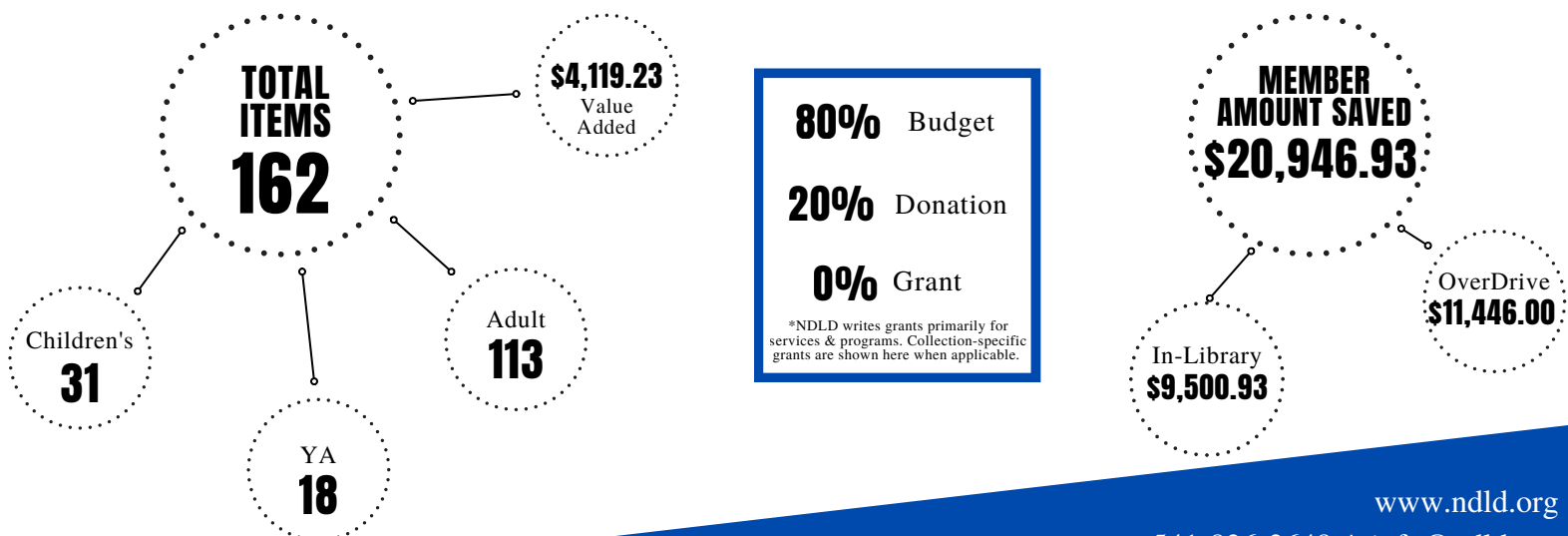

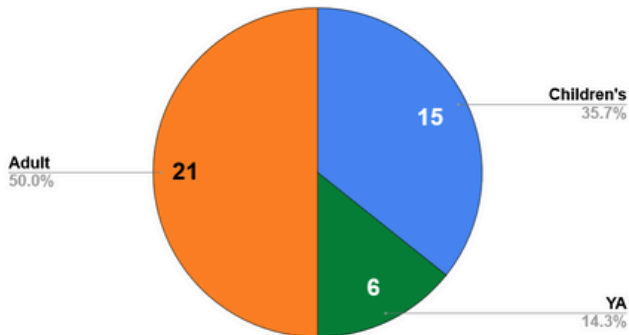

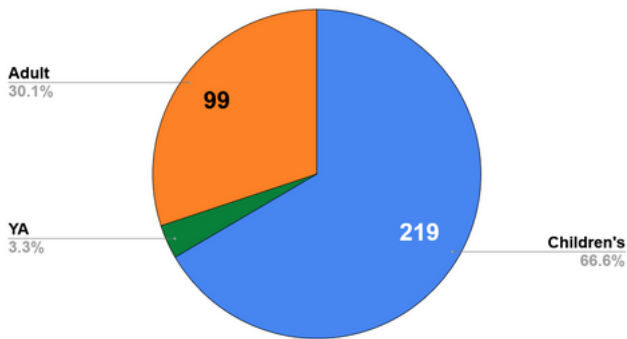

This event is geared for teens (6th through 12th grades) & adults.

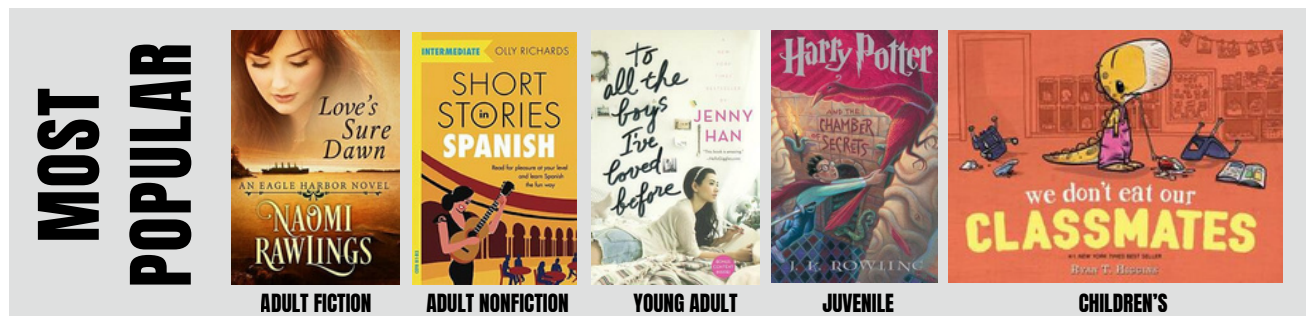
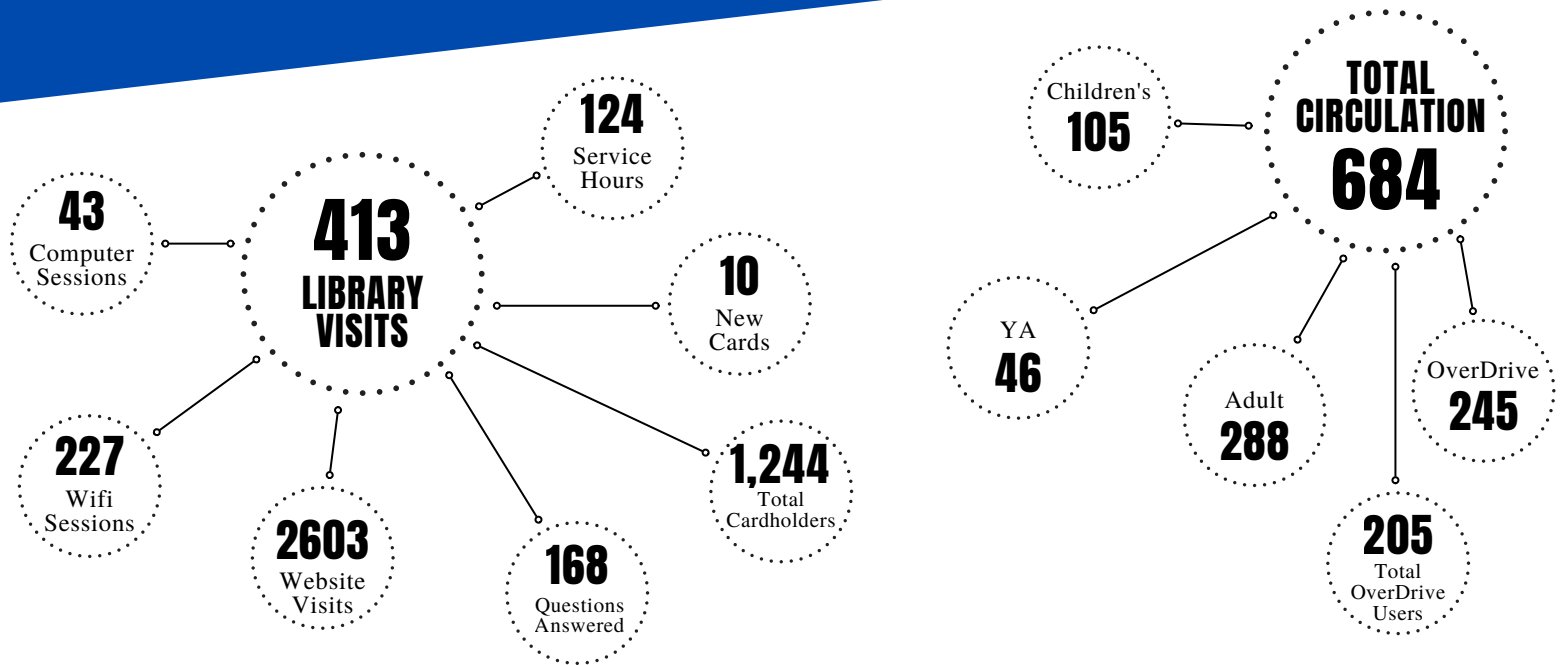




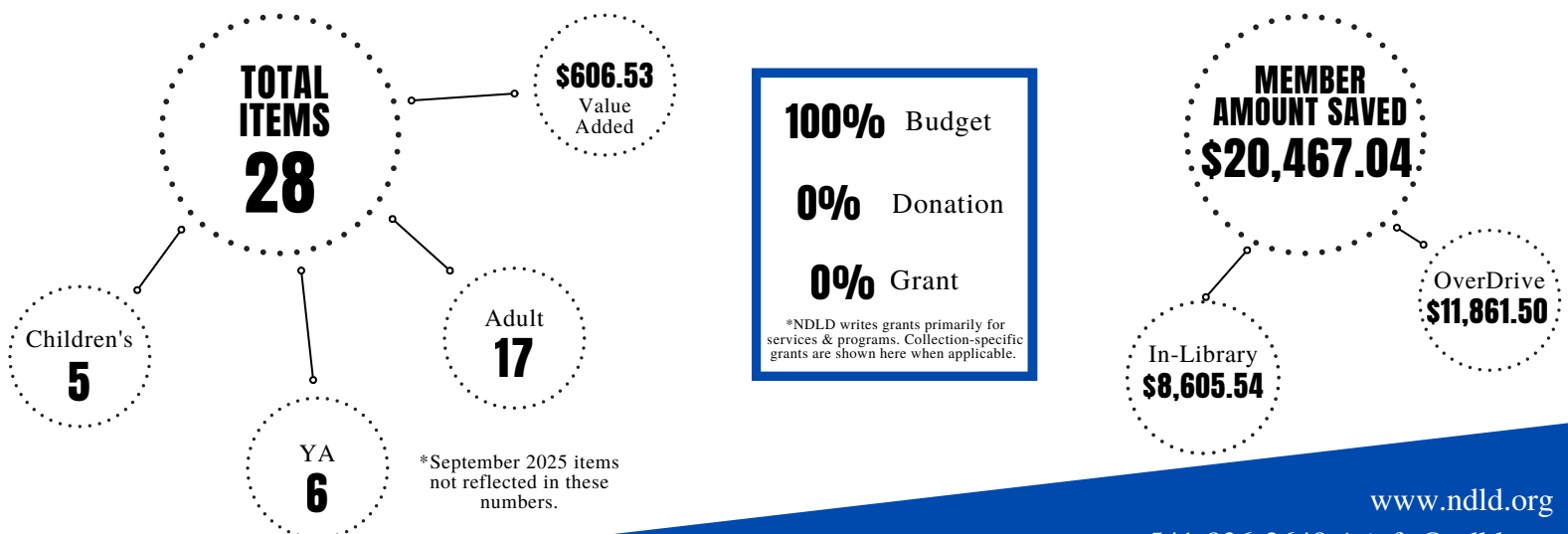

LIBRARY SNAPSHOT: SUMMER READING 2025 WRAP UP

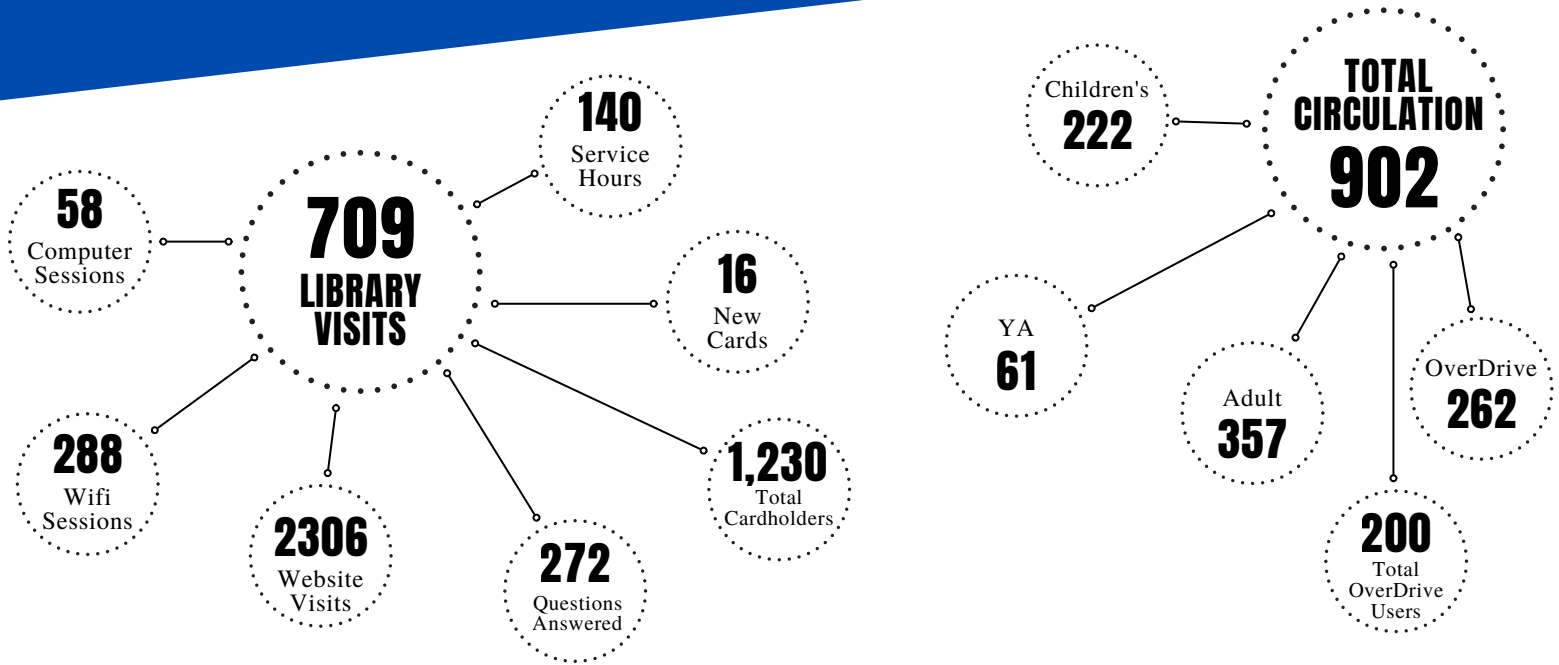
- Summer Reading 2025 wrapped up on August 16 after 11 weeks of reading and activities! Summer Reading is completely free for all participants each year. Summer Reading at the North Douglas Library District aims to maintain or improve literacy levels for all ages throughout the summer in ways they find interesting and engaging.
- **This year's program by the numbers:**
 - 101 people registered.
 - Over 50 weekly prizes given out! Weekly prizes included themed shirts, tote bags, ND Memorial Pool passes, Country Cabin gift certificates, and more.
 - 4 grand prize winners received gift certificates to either Bookshop.org or a local bookstore of their choice. 2 children winners each received \$50 gift certificates, 1 teen winner received a \$100 certificate, and 1 adult winner received a \$100 certificate.
 - An estimated 800 free books were given out to participants!
 - The library offered 101 in-person and on-your-own events and activities this summer with 1,245 total attendance.
 - 127,320 total reading minutes submitted for prize tickets, or 2,122 hours.
- Summer Reading 2025 was made possible through the generous support of: the Friends of the Mildred Whipple Library, the Whipple Foundation Fund (administered by Oregon Community Foundation), the Ford Family Foundation, the State Library of Oregon Ready to Read Grant (funded through Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) grants), the City of Drain, and the North Douglas School District.



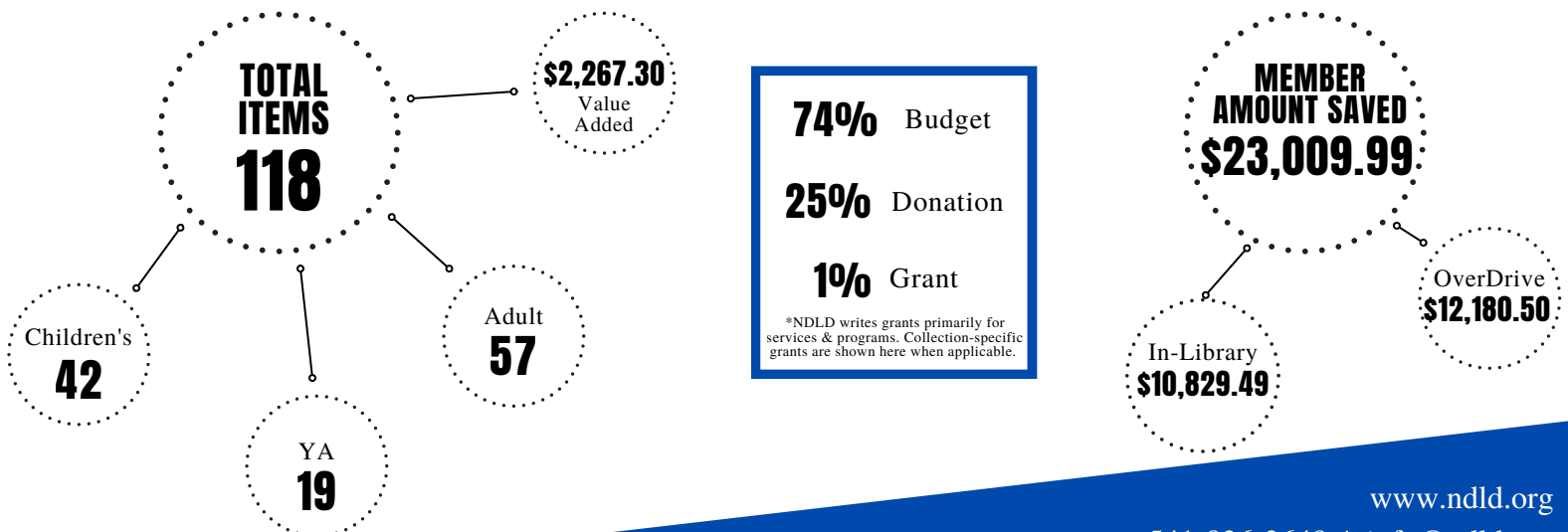

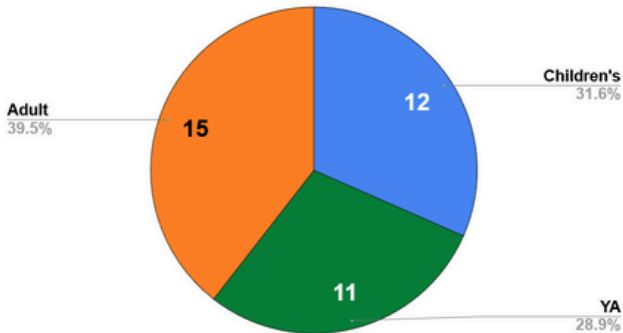

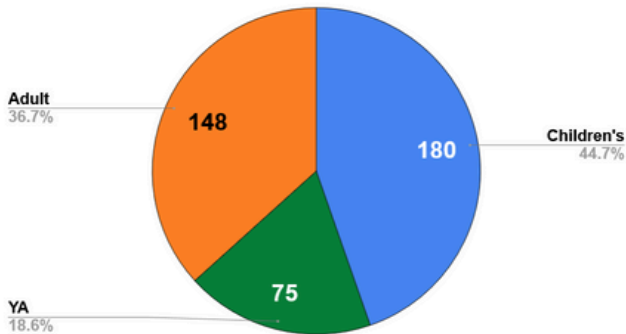
